

1 Student Schedule
The district will provide full day sessions starting at 8:15 am through 2:15 pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays and Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays will end for students at 12:50 pm on the West, Lumberton, and Transition campuses and 12:00 pm at the Alternative School in Mt. Laurel with all students attending instructional activities as assigned excluding those students who have elected for 100% remote learning.

2 Distance Learning
Parents can elect to have their child take part in distance learning full time. Classes will be taught by teachers who provide live lessons and assignments through a device, apps, and district approved software. Changes requested to mode of learning are by marking period. Please contact the principal.

3 Desks & Classrooms
Students classes and schedules have been arranged to allow for social distancing. Some areas such as common areas or gymnasium or all-purpose rooms may be used for therapies and classrooms. Classroom desks and tables will be cleaned, disinfected, and sanitized on a daily basis. Students and staff will be expected to clean hands upon entering and exiting the classroom.

4 Masks & Face Coverings
Students and staff are required to wear face coverings at all times. The District will provide 5 masks to each student and staff member. If there are medical conditions and an accommodation is sought please contact principal or BCSSD Personnel respectively.

5 Monitoring Symptoms
Parents/guardians will assist their child with monitoring symptoms each day as well as completing a screening questionnaire prior to sending a student to school. Temperature checks will be conducted and any students with symptoms must stay home or will be sent home.

6 Special Education
Students with IEPs, or in need of accommodations, will be contacted by their case managers and/or guidance counselors to discuss their specific instructional program, schedule and supports. Significant resources will be provided by the district to support social and emotional learning and wellbeing.

7 Limited Building Access
Parents, vendors, and the public will have limited building access throughout the school year. Please refrain from coming to schools, except when called to do so.

8 Local and County Health Officials
The school district will abide by the advice of local health officials in order to maintain a safe learning environment for students and staff.

9 Accommodations
Students with underlying health conditions and are looking for an accommodation should contact their building principal. Staff with underlying health conditions shall contact the BCSSD Personnel Office with the request and accompanying documentation.

10 Hand Washing and Sanitizer Access
Students and staff will be strongly encouraged to wash their hands on a consistent basis with soap and water. Hand sanitizers will be available at all designated entrances/exits, in every classroom, and near or in cafeterias.

Transportation
Masks must be worn on all buses. Bus transportation provided by the BCIT district will have one student per seat near the window. A Covid-19 prescreening questionnaire will need to be filled out by the parent prior to a student getting on a bus. Sending district bus contractors will have their respective protocols in place for social distancing and facial coverings. No student will be permitted into a school building without a Covid-19 prescreening questionnaire on the Genesis Parent Portal and temperature taken.

Clear Acrylic Guards
Clear acrylic guard barriers will be installed in high traffic areas where needed in the main office, nurse's office, therapy rooms and any area deemed needed by the administration.

Ventilation and Air Conditioning
All mechanical air systems in our schools were inspected to ensure they are operational and provide fresh air ventilation. Heightened monitoring of all ventilation systems will occur.

Contact Tracing
If a person is positive for COVID-19, recommended quarantine protocols devised by the CDC and local health department will be followed. School officials and nurses will assist with contact tracing.

Signage
The district will have universal signage posted throughout the inside and outside of each building to address important issues related to compliance prior to entering a building and while attending school during COVID-19. Masks and Covid-19 prescreening forms are non-negotiables.

Parent and Student Training
Parents and students will have access to tutorials on the reopening of school and demonstrate how to utilize our district technology.

Electronic Devices
Our district is committed to assure that students are equitably treated. Appropriate assistive technology or electronic devices are distributed where applicable in support of the goals & objectives according to students' IEP. WIFI supports will be provided where needed.

Facility Cleaning Practices
All custodians in the district have and will continue to be trained in best practices in cleaning and preferred products during the pandemic. Products used are in accordance with state and federal guidelines. Protocols are in place for ongoing cleaning and sanitizing throughout the day.

Meals
Students will have prepared breakfast and lunch served in classrooms at each campus location. Remote learners will receive meals with an onsite Grab N Go option. Students may bring clear water bottles for hydration.

Extracurricular Activities and Athletics
Athletic events such as Special Olympics, Volleyball and Bowling may be limited or suspended based on local Board of Education decisions and local health department guidelines. Extracurricular club activities shall be run remotely or in a hybrid model if in person.
