Transition Campus

- Received NJSBA 2020 School Leader Award for an Exemplary Program
- Created multi-tiered Transition skills development program that positions students to meet all students' goals, needs, and interests
- Established on-campus work experiences with local businesses and groups who provide outsource goods for production and assembly that mirror workplace skills while maintaining safety during the COVID-19 pandemic
- Adopted a new online program called Digitability, with a key focus on digital literacy, workreadiness, and social emotional learning skills
- Developed a variety of work-based learning experiences on campus:
 - Pioneer Posh online retail store young adults practice a magnitude of low to complex employable skills to support growth in an online retail environment.
 - Pioneer Logistics a warehouse to coordinate district's school supply orders. Young adults take inventory, stock shelves, prepare and deliver orders, track inventory and communicate the status of orders.
 - Pioneer Creation Station to fill district orders for bulletin boards, craft activities, and presentations supplies. Large orders are packaged for distribution throughout our district's school community.
 - Work Based Learning Lab a simulated work experience for young adults to obtain career exploration, daily living, and soft or essential work skills using independent and group structured tasks.
- Continuing to partner with Rowan College at Burlington County (RCBC) to offer opportunities to eligible students to take college courses.
- Recognized as a leading transition program and highlighted in the Transition To Adulthood for People With Autism Webinar sponsored by NJ Congressman Kim.

Burlington County Alternative School (BCAS) at Mt. Laurel
